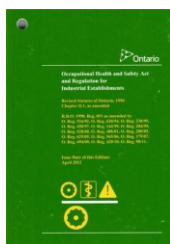

## JHSC Part 1 Certification Training

This approved three-day Part 1 Certification course was developed by **Dwight Barratt Consulting Inc.** and addresses the curriculum requirements for certified members of JHSC.

Health and Safety Representatives, Health and Safety Coordinators, supervisors and managers could also benefit from this training

Upon successful completion of the evaluation written at the end of the Part 1 training program the participants will receive a certificate of completion from the training provider who will notify the Ministry of Labour, Immigration, Training & Skills Development (MLITSD) that the participant has successfully completed that the worker has successfully completed Part 1 Certification Training.

Participants will be able to:

- Work effectively as key members of a Joint Health and Safety Committee
- Carry out the responsibilities of a certified member and advise on hazard evaluations and controls in the workplace.
- Conduct workplace inspections, participate in accident investigations, and respond to work refusals.
- Work as an integral part of the Internal Responsibility System to ensure a safe and healthy workplace.

After successful completion of the required Part 2 training modules, the training provider will notify the MLITSD that the participant has successfully completed the training to become a Certified Member of the JHSC.

Certified members trained under the new Standards will be required to take Refresher training every three years to maintain certification status, or may obtain a one-time exemption for an active JHSC member
