Report from Subgroups:

- **Treasurer**: Sat said that the CAER group had made several donations including:

- Sat said that Anco sponsored \$5000 to Vaughan Fire for testing sticks to test smoke alarms.

Emergency Response:

Safety Moment: "Safety Video on Cannabis Use"

- The group saw a video on cannabis use.
- The video said that the concentrations of the key components of cannabis have changed over the years with THC levels going up and CBD levels going down.
- The video said that cannabis is seen as a "gateway drug" that leads to other stronger drugs.

Presentation: "Reefer Madness – A Look at What's Ahead for Employers" by Lisa Bolton of Sherrard Kuzz LLP

- Lisa Bolton made a presentation on cannabis in the workplace.
- Health Canada says that "Using cannabis or cannabis products can impair your concentration, ability to think and make decisions, reaction time and coordination. This can affect motor skills, including ability to drive. It can increase anxiety and cause panic attacks, paranoia and hallucinations.

- These effects can last 24 hours (or more).
- Lisa described the 3 types of impairment acute, residual and withdrawl.
- Acute impairment includes:
 - Perceptual changes, time distortion
 - o Euphoria-"high", relaxed-"numb"
 - Cognitive changes-memory and learning
 - Attention
 - Reaction time
- Residual impairment includes:
 - Fatique
 - Comprehension issues
 - Unclear mind
 - Attention
 - Reaction time
- Types of Impairment: Withdrawal
 - Anger, irritability
 - o Insomnia, nightmares
 - Anxiety
 - Anorexia
 - General malaise
- Prohibitions are governed by Provincial laws, Municipal by-laws, Highway Traffic Act, OHSA, and Human Rights.
- Lisa outlined the why employers should develop & implement a drug & alcohol policy:
 - Provide a safe, productive workplace
 - Control workplace activity
 - Communicate standards of conduct
 - Promote consistent manager response
 - Ensure all employees are treated fairly and with respect
- The scope of drug & alcohol policy should include all sources of intoxicating substances including alcohol, prescription & over-the counter drugs, cannabis (and related products) and Illegal drugs.
- Lisa outlined various components of a drug & policy, detecting use & intoxication, response, and decisions of interest.
